Dr. Douglas A. Brook

Dr. Douglas A. Brook, PhD Public Policy '01, is visiting professor in the Sanford School of Public Policy at Duke University. He is also Professor Emeritus at the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School where he served as dean of the school of business and public policy and director of the Center for Defense Management Research.

Brook held four presidentially appointed positions in the two Bush administrations. From 2007 to 2009, he served first as assistant secretary of the U.S. Navy (financial management and comptroller) and later as acting undersecretary of defense (comptroller)/chief financial officer. In 1992, he was acting director of the U. S. Office of Personnel Management, and from 1990 to 1992 he served as assistant secretary of the U.S. Army (financial management).

In the private sector, Brook was vice president-government relations for both LTV Corporation and the Libbey-Owens-Ford Company. From 1982 to 1990, he managed his own public affairs consulting practice. He also served on active and reserve duty in the U.S. Navy, retiring at the rank of captain.



Brook received the Liskin Award for teaching excellence at the Naval Postgraduate School, the Sanford School's Stubbing Teaching and Mentoring Award, and the Alumni Service Award from the Ford School of Public Policy. He is a distinguished alumnus of the Navy Supply Corps.

Brook also holds a BA in political science and a master of public administration degree from the *University of Michigan*.
