Anthony Amos, MPP '24, is only the second African American in the City of Fairfax's history to serve on City Council. He co-leads the Move Fairfax Steering Committee, focused on addressing traffic circulation in Old Town and pedestrian safety. He represents the city on the Water and Air Quality Committees with the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and the Virginia Municipal League. He is leading the creation of the city's first-ever affordable housing strategic plan, and the effort to create Virginia's first kindergarten-to-college fund.

During his time at George Mason University, he represented the Schar School as a graduate student ambassador and served as the director of student outreach for Bridge at Mason, as well as being inducted into multiple honor societies for his academic performance.

While in school, he also became engaged by joining the Central Fairfax Chamber of Commerce, and in the City of Fairfax, sat on the Independence Day Celebration Committee and was appointed to the George Mason University Fairfax Campus Advisory Board. He now sits on the leadership team for the Fairfax NAACP, State Charitable Gaming Board, Fairfax Rotarians, and volunteers with groups including the League of Women Voters, the Lamb Center, and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.
